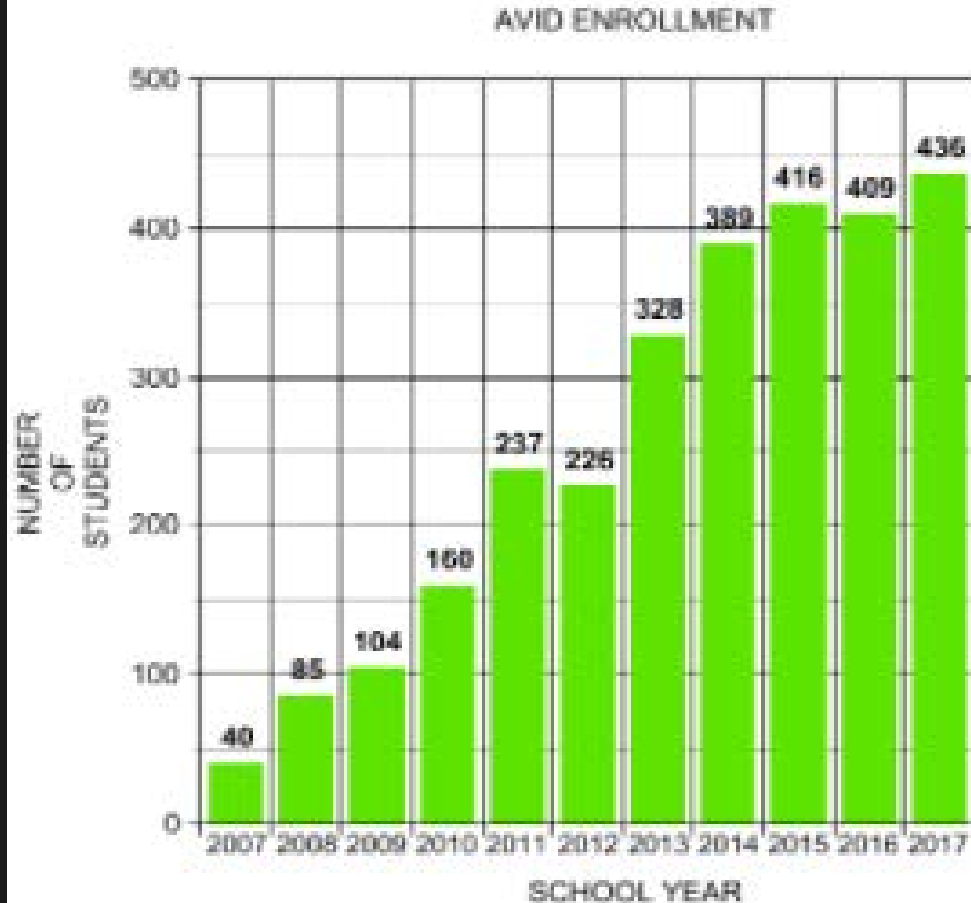

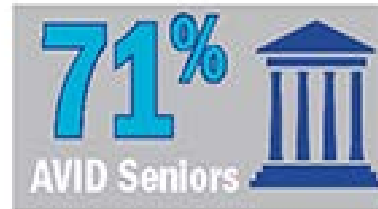

## AVID Graduates: Enroll in College at Higher Rates

AVID 2014 seniors outpaced the national average of enrolling in either a two- or four-year college the first fall term after high school. This success is remarkable considering AVID's population is largely comprised of students typically underrepresented in higher education.

# Southern Feeder Pattern Highlights

## Monticello High School

2012-2016:

100% of AVID graduates accepted to a four-year college/university (58 students).

89% of AVID graduates have attended a four year college/university.

11% pursued other postsecondary education options, (PVCC, Military, Trade School, etc.).

2016-2017, 18 of 19 students have already been accepted to a four year college/university.

## Walton Middle School

Expansion of the AVID elective class into the 6th grade.

Over 10% of Walton students are enrolled in the AVID elective class.

Students in grades 7th & 8th have an 80% pass rate on SOL's
